Election of 1800

- Thomas Jefferson vs John Adams vs Arron Burr
 - No Candidate gets the majority votes needed, so it goes to the house of representative
 - Hamilton screws Burr and Jefferson becomes President
- Revolution of 1800:
 - A peaceful transition of power from federalist to Democratic Republicans



Jefferson as President

- During his presidency, TJ needs to worry about the divide between federalist and JDRs
- Judiciary Act 1801 “Midnight Judges”
 - Adams appoints 16 new judges before leaving office- March 3rd- 9:00pm
 - Congress repealed the act some new judges didn't get their jobs
 - John Marshall (federalist) - appointed chief justice a month before
 - William Marbury does not get his appointment
- Leading to Marbury v Madison (1803)



Marbury v Madison

- James Madison prevented Marbury from taking his position
- Marbury sues to get his position
- Established precedent that ONLY the Supreme Court can declared things unconstitutional.
- Known as Judicial Review
- Jefferson and the JDRS pissed
 - -try to impeach South Carolina Judge Samuel Chase
 - Does not work and there has not been an attempt since



Peaceful Coercion

- Attempts to avoid war in a peaceful manor
 1. Non-importation agreements
 2. Olive branch petition
 3. The association- total boycott
 4. Embargo of 1807
 5. Non-Intercourse act (1809)

 7. Jeff Boats- Shrinking the Navy
