For each proper name (e.g. John Smith), or proper group name (Toltec) which may appear, explain why this individual/group was famous (for example, who they are [were], their significance, achievement or contribution, etc.)

Please remember that XCREDIT opportunities cannot be turned in late, nor will you receive the extra credit for a partial list. This is really an ALL OR NOTHING opportunity. DON'T FORGET TO ANNOTATE YOUR NAME, PERIOD, DATE AND TITLE OF ASSIGNMENT, SO NOT TO LOSE POINTS
